Students' Works

4 Important Things about Lack of Competition Writing in Homeschooling is

1. Read the topics carefully!

I know it may sound stupid, but if you only get a mere glimpse of the topic and hastily start writing, you'll probably fail to identify the focus of the topic and thus lose plenty of marks for irrelevancy. To avoid this, make sure you highlight all the keywords in the question and write a brief summary of your ideas first. You should also refer to the topic regularly to check whether your content matches and fulfils the requirements of the topic.

2. Free your time to learn English!

Despite your busy schedule, you ought to squeeze some time out for reading an English book or newspaper every day. You might as well watch some TV programmes and movies (in English of course) at weekends, too. Having continuous exposure to English does help you appreciate others and enrich yourself with different views and knowledge. Only then will you be able to develop and express your ideas well in writing. Remember, balance your time and be fair to English!

3. Build your foundation!

Writing is like building a house, the more effort you put in, the more you get in return! In the story 'The Three Little Pigs', only the third little pig survived in the end since he had used the right tools and materials to build his house. Similarly, we need accurate grammar and well-chosen vocabulary to write well. Just keep reading and practising grammar, you will see how your vocabulary has expanded and grammar accuracy has improved soon. You must act before it's too late!

4. Practice makes perfect!

You should finish one or two pieces of writing every week (your homework writing assignments should not be counted though) so that your English teachers can figure out your problems and the grammatical mistakes you make and then you can seek their guidance and make self-improvement earlier. It's always true that hard work does pay off and there is no shortcut anyway! Good luck and strive for your goals!

Lack of Competition in Homeschooling is Detrimental to Students' Well-being and Growth in Hong Kong

To start with, homeschooling lacks the necessary competitiveness required to produce bright young individuals. In general cases, there are only 1 to 3 kids in a family. In other words, a child has no sense of competition. For example, if a family decides to homeschool all of their children, they may just need to compete with only one to two other children; or in other cases, if just one child is homeschooled, she has no idea of what a competition is. As a result, a competition-free environment will demotivate people and they cannot see the significance in studying and doing better, as they have no one to compare themselves to.

Whereas in public or private schools, normally students will need to compete with the whole class, providing constructive competition and a driving force to boost the class's morale. According to an article entitled, "Positive & Negative Effects of Competition" by Kristine Tucker, published on Demand Media, the writer mentioned that competition plays an important role in academic achievement because it often spurs students to pursue and strive for excellence. This article reflects that academic pressure can challenge students to work harder in their studies. Thus, the academic results of school students will be better than homeschooled students since homeschooling cannot arouse the awareness of competition.

Overall, even though homeschooling may seem like a diversified and student-centered educational option, it is not all it's cracked up to be. Think before you act.
